

GENERAL SERVICE SMALL

APPLICABILITY:

This rate is applicable to all Consumers for power and lighting services through one meter, used for commercial, small industrial, three phase village, farm or rural service.

TYPE OF SERVICE:

Single or three-phase at available voltages.

RATE:

Customer Charge:	\$15.00 per month	
Energy Charge:	July through September	\$0.09826 per kWh.
	October through June	\$0.08826 per kWh.

LOAD MANAGEMENT CREDIT:

If the Consumer contracts with the Cooperative under its Load Management Program whereby the Cooperative has the option of interrupting service to the Consumer when the Cooperative is approaching peak conditions, a monthly credit of \$9.00 per kW of maximum demand will be provided. This maximum demand will be established by the consumer for any fifteen (15) consecutive minute period during the period for which the bill is rendered, as indicated or recorded by a demand meter and adjusted for power factor. The load management credit will be available only in the months of July, August and September. If, for any reason, the Cooperative chooses not to control load during a given month, no credits will be given for that month.

The Consumer will be eligible for this load management credit only when the monthly load factor equals or exceeds thirty percent (30%).

$$\text{Load factor} = \frac{\text{Energy Consumption (kWh)}}{\text{Maximum Demand (kW)} \times 24 \text{ hrs/day} \times \text{days in billing cycle}}$$

DETERMINATION OF HORSEPOWER:

The horsepower for billing purposes shall be determined, as necessary, by a demand meter or other test each year and shall be the horsepower input to the motor.

### CONDITIONS OF SERVICE:

1. Motors having a rated capacity in excess of ten horsepower (10 hp) must be three-phase unless they are of a type approved by Cooperative;
2. Service under this schedule is limited to loads not in excess of 25 kW. If the demand exceeds 25 kW for two (2) consecutive months, the applicable schedule may be applied for a period of not less than one (1) year unless Consumer's load changes, thereby requiring reclassification to another schedule;
3. Consumers having their homes on the same premises with their business establishment may include both the home and the business on the same meter and be billed under this schedule; or, if the Consumer prefers, he may make provisions for two meters, in which case his home will be billed on the applicable residential schedule and his usage for other purposes will be billed under this schedule;
4. If it is necessary to make extensions or to reinforce distribution lines to provide service, the customer charge will be determined in accordance with the Line Extension Policy as set forth in the Rules and Regulations; and
5. If the revenue to be derived from, or the duration of the prospective business is not of sufficient term to warrant the investment on the minimum as determined by the Line Extension Policy, Cooperative may require an adequate customer charge calculated upon reasonable consideration before undertaking to supply service. In any event, Consumer will be required to sign an Electric Service Agreement as to character, customer charge and duration of the business offered.

### TERMS OF PAYMENT:

In accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Cooperative as they currently exist or may be amended from time to time.
